

### MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

#### Dear Parents/Guardians,

The month of May has brought beautiful weather, and our students have been enjoying being outdoors for recesses and classes. However, gophers have returned to the property. Students are reminded to leave the gophers alone. We are working on a solution to this problem, but it will more than likely not happen until the summer. We appreciate your patience as we work towards a solution.

Students wrapped up their sustainable living classes with Grandma Dallas earlier this month. The Plant Sale was a huge success, with students raising just under \$3000! The proceeds from this fundraiser will be put towards sustainable living projects next year. We will start the Fall with the building of raised garden beds to get ready for Spring 2026 planting, as unfortunately the gophers have stalled our plans for the outdoor garden this year.

For the remainder of the year, sustainable living will be led by Kari and Cory Duce, in collaboration with our staff. Thank you, Kari and Cory! Our Grades 5-9 students will focus on electronics, house wiring, and preserving food, while our K-4 students will learn about foraging and will be making tea.

In May, our weekly EVE presentations have given our students the opportunity to learn more about careers in veterinary medicine, vermicomposting, construction, and conservational ecology. We thank our presenters for volunteering their time to share their experiences with our students. 
### **EVE PRESENTATIONS**
