MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back! It has been a spectacular September here at GVRA! Students have been so busy learning and growing.

Our Kindergarten students are learning letter names and sounds and the numbers 0-5, as well as how to be a good learner. They were excited to learn with apples and to go potato harvesting at Grandma Dallas's farm. Our Grade 1/2 class has been enjoying math concept games and spending time outdoors for lessons. In the Grade 3/4 class, students have been learning about place value and are focusing on grammar. They have also been discussing the importance of having a growth mindset. The Grade 4/5 class has been working on place value and number sense, and they have also been creating items to sell at the Pumpkin Festival, while the Grade 6 class is studying climate and weather, enjoying cross country running, learning about resilience and redemption through a novel study, and developing their skills in patterns and algebra.

Moving on to our Junior and Senior High students, our Grade 7/8 class is learning about indigenous societies and is focusing on short stories and integers. Our Grade 9 class has been exploring themes of leadership and chaos in their novel study, and they are learning about square roots of numbers. Finally, our Grade 10 students have been building annotations in English, and those taking Foods have been working through food basics and contemporary baking.

This year, we are excited to share that boys' and girls' volleyball is underway. Thank you to Mr. Brown and Mrs. Miller for coaching our students. GVRA students are also competing in cross country events under the direction of Mrs. Armson. Our students are amazing ambassadors for our school!

Families are also excited for the Gwynne Pumpkin Festival, which takes place on Saturday, September 27th from 2-8 pm. We look forward to seeing you there!

What an exciting and interactive first EVE presentation of the year!






MICHELLE HAUSER
